

This 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 375 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

2009 was an interesting vintage in Tasmania, showing extremely high wine grape quality coupled with low to very low vineyard yields (arising in part from frosts and high winds in some areas).

VGR denotes "Variable Grams Residual" natural grape sugar, which means the fermentation was stopped earlier than usual to balance a higher level of residual grape sugar with the natural acidity of the wine.

This Riesling is produced in a slightly richer and more luscious style with a fresh floral and perfumed nose. The palate is rich and seamless, with lime and citrus flavours. Despite its luscious palate, this Riesling has a refreshing finish and is ideal with seafood and Asian style cuisine.
