

The 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island, while the history of Marion Bay itself goes all the way back to 1642, the date of Abel Tasman's first landing. Since then, Fred Peacock has expanded the Pinot Noir plantings, introduced Sauvignon Blanc and pioneered Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 390 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2013 was a dream vintage in many ways – great flowering, relatively dry weather with low disease pressure and a warmer than average summer, which provided the warmth and length in the season to fully mature the grapes

In what is quite probably a "world first," we have taken our (nearly) Australian exclusive Schönburger variety and turned it into something new; a lightly sparkling rosé in a *frizzante* style. Salmon coloured with a touch of bronze, it is exuberant, fun and slightly bubbly. Aromas bounce out of the glass with glacé cherry, butterscotch and a touch of Turkish Delight.

Deliberately less "fizzy" than other sparkling wines, it feels soft, fruity and gently sweet on the palate. Irresistible on its own, you can also try pairing it with caramelised apples and good vanilla ice cream and with only 7.1% alcohol, you only need to feel guilty about the ice cream!
