Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium wines from Tasmania's naturally cool climate and has been rewarded with 20 trophies and over 420 show medals since 1990. Our 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1974, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted what was arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Tasting Note

More rain than usual and a cold snap in November and December meant that flowering was disrupted, hence yields for vintage 2014 were significantly down across all southern Australian states. However, these lower yields meant that the fruit from that vintage was of excellent quality, with perfect balance between flavour and physiological ripeness.

A Sauvignon Blanc in the traditional Bream Creek style with aromas of lime, crushed blackcurrant leaf and hints of pineapple and passionfruit. It has a rich mouth feel and a full flavoured palate showing citrus fruits and a touch of herbs.

With an excellent balance between fruit intensity and structure, this wine is equally ideal with aperitifs, seafood or richly flavoured dishes.
